## CrossReach awarded grant to support disadvantaged children

CrossReach has secured a grant for £258,000 which will enable it to continue supporting some of the most vulnerable, disadvantaged children in society. Paul Gilroy, Head of Service for Children and Family, said the money awarded by the Scottish Government would be used to help youngsters aged 8 and under and their



parents to improve life chances: "This fund replaces the Third sector Early Intervention fund and will enable us to continue our Daisy Chain Early Years Project in the Govanhill area of Glasgow as a core service. In addition, it will enable us to continue to support and implement the 'Getting it Right for Every Child' principles in communities across Scotland." Daisy Chain was established in 2011 to try and meet the needs of families often described as 'hard to reach'. There has been a particular focus on reaching out to the migrant population in Govanhill, particularly the Roma community. Paul added: "The grant will mean

we can develop play-based interventions to promote attachment amongst parents and children in marginalised groups. These are now being integrated in Perth Prison Visitors Centre with children affected by imprisonment and at Sunflower Garden in Edinburgh with children affected by parental substance misuse."

## **Social Care Mission Officer appointed**

Liann Weir has taken on a new post as Social Care Mission Officer. The job's remit includes researching current social care projects in the Church of Scotland and encouraging and nurturing them. The role will also help to develop close working relationships with other Councils of the Church to further social care. Liann, who has been seconded for a year from her post as co-ordinator of the Daisy Chain Early Years Project in Glasgow, says she is excited by the new challenge: "I am looking forward to finding out about the fantastic social care initiatives currently being provided by congregations and identifying ways in which CrossReach can support, connect and inspire local projects. Our new social care forum website (www.socialcareforum.scot) provides a unique opportunity to connect services

## **Recovery Volunteers Graduation**

Eight people who have turned their lives of addiction around were recognised recently at a special 'Recovery Volunteers Graduation' in Edinburgh. Each had been helped by CrossReach to embark on their own personal recovery journey, including Stella, now a support worker at Rainbow House in Glasgow, who shared her journey from the isolation of addiction to gaining an SVQ level 2 and a full-time job. The significance of the day and the graduates' achievements was summed up by a family member who said: "Thank you for giving me my brother back. I don't think you know what you do for the families. You saved mine." In his closing remarks CrossReach CEO Peter Bailey made the following observations: "We are all the same. We are all on a journey. We all question ourselves. We all have to persist. Don't look at me as the CEO – look at me as someone who has to persist."

#### CrossReach contributes to new SSSC booklet

CrossReach has joined with other professional bodies and the Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC) to produce a new booklet called 'The Impact of Promoting Excellence in Social Service settings'. It features CrossReach's dementia learning journey in Promoting Excellence. Dementia Development Officer Pamela Mackay explains more: "CrossReach has been committed to training all staff in dementia care since the early 1980s. Recent developments have helped us enhance our learning, and Promoting Excellence has really made a difference. One example was the refurbishment of our care home, Bellfield in Banchory. When plans were drawn up they didn't include an outside garden area. Service manager, Janis Grub, spoke with developers about adding gardens that residents could access. She used her knowledge from Promoting Excellence and explained the quality of life outcomes statement: 'People with dementia maintain their best level of physical, mental, social and emotional wellbeing'. I worked with the team to see what might work well in terms of outdoor space and signage so that was enabling and welcoming. It's important we help people to achieve the things in life that are most important to them and engaging with Promoting Excellence helps us to do that."
