Join us to hear about the exciting project that has seen church orchards in Scotland twinned with church orchards in Hungary. You will hear about the project, how it began and get an overview of the amazing work that has been happening through congregations in both countries.

Does your church have any ground around where a few fruit trees could be planted? There will be a follow-up event on Monday 14 June when we will hear more from the four Scottish eco-congregations involved - <u>Greyfriars Kirk</u> and <u>St Ninian's Scottish Episcopal Church</u> both in Edinburgh, <u>Colston Milton Parish</u> in north Glasgow and <u>Newton Mearns Baptist Church</u> - about how they have developed their own orchards in the grounds and surrounding areas of their churches.

The twinning project saw <u>The Church of Scotland</u> and <u>Reformed Church in Hungary</u> lead work in partnership with <u>Ökogyülekezeti Mozgalom (Eco-Congregation Hungary)</u>, <u>Eco-Congregation Scotland</u>, training from a UK charity <u>The Orchard Project</u> and funding from the <u>European Christian Environment</u> Network (ECEN).
