

News



A group of Dunfermline Churches launched the second year of #angelseverywheredunfermline with the arrival of two sets of wings; one at the Louise Carnegie Gates to Pittencrieff Park, the other at the Queen Anne Street entrance to the Kingsgate shopping centre.

Rev MaryAnn Rennie explains that, "This year we picked up the theme of angelseverywhere as an opportunity to try and encourage a little lightness into all of our lives, and as a reminder of the kind of angels that may be in our midst."

The group asked Fife College if they would be willing to make angels wings that others could stand in front of for "selfies". Dennis Savage and his team at Fife College said "yes", and what they have created is perfect!

The project continued to grow further as over the next few weeks others said "yes". The Kingsgate Centre offered a unit to display children's angel artwork. Dunfermline High School created a series of photographic images and these were shared in various forms. And Fife College gave a third set of wings that appeared over the weekend.



Rev Muriel Willoughby describes it being, "great to see the variety of folk who dropped into the unit from teachers coming to see their class work, the centre security guard, a Tesco employee who is a Christian and was glad that we were taking the opportunity to share the Good News, to lots of families with children coming to see their handiwork."

Rev Mike Weaver highlights that, "the team who have met and worked on this has not had to be wholly minister led and it's wonderful to see cross church working, and of course the buzz from those who have 'delved' into the Kings Gate centre. My prayer would be for more of this shared work in the community, encouraged by ministers growing in relationship and our "congregations growing in appreciation of one another."

There are other surprises to come. But in the meantime the hope is that residents and visitors to Dunfermline will take some pictures and post them to Instagram and Facebook with the hashtag #angelseverywheredunfermline

The churches are very grateful to all those who have said "yes". And look forward to expanding this and other shared mission initiatives in future, as to quote MaryAnn, "there is lots of hope to be shared"!

Fife Presbytery 2:10 Mission Fund Results

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." - Ephesians 2:10

I'm delighted to share with you the results from Fife Presbytery's first 2:10 Mission Fund!

The 2:10 Mission Fund was designed as a creative approach to support and develop mission initiatives across Fife Presbytery, by: putting our money where our mission is!

We advertised in November as having £30k available to distribute before the end of the year, or otherwise lost to Presbytery.

Our priorities on this first occasion were to fund mission initiatives that either:

- Developed mission through new worshipping communities OR
- Engaged and attracted those under 40 including children and young people

These reflected goals identified at our recent Presbytery Strategy Workshop in September.

Despite a very tight timescale, you responded and the Board of Mission received a high number of excellent applications from across Presbytery, applying for a total in excess of £90k!

This meant that shortlisting was challenging for us and a number of otherwise good applications were not taken forward. However, we did select and shortlist 5 excellent mission initiatives.

Then it was over to you. Over 300 people across presbytery participated in the Fife Presbytery 2:10 Mission Fund: Your Choice voting!

Thank you to everyone who voted and participated.

Results

With thanks to the diligent and effective management of Presbytery finances by Sarah Wood and the Board of Management, the final available budget for the 2:10 Mission fund was confirmed as being higher than the £30k originally advertised. The final Mission Fund available totalled: £50k!!!

I'm pleased therefore to share that the results are as follows:

Total awarded: £50k

Pre 2019 Pandemic, the numbers of people experiencing one or more of the seven categories of poverty detailed in the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation were increasing. The impact of the pandemic has enlarged the numbers across the board.

Many parish churches have been working with families, schools, community groups, charities, council, ecumenically and with Council and Third Sector agencies to defeat the evil of poverty. As a new presbytery, how can we respectfully discern usefulness and potential impact, to complement and build on this work?

The 5 Marks of Mission include these commitments:

- 3. To respond to human need by loving service
- 4. To transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation
- 5. To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth

Alan will share his experience of planting churches and supporting pioneers across Scotland to inspire us, as we consider possibilities for Fife Presbytery.





At Cairn we believe in the importance of investing in what matters and that is you. We all know that leadership is not easy... we need support along the way and that is what huddle is about.



This year the theme is **INFLUENCERS**.


Who influences you the most? What would life look like if Jesus was your greatest influence? What do you think of the fact that Jesus was voted the number one greatest influencer of all time?

Over the 30+ years of pioneering new, contextual forms of church we've found that the part of the Fresh Expressions/Loving First journey people struggle with the most is introducing a spiritual element to their gatherings in a sensitive and contextual way which is why we created this resource.

Sharing Jesus adopts an open-handed, walking together, learning from one another, asking questions approach. It's not about telling people what to believe, but about saying to friends: "This is what I am finding helpful. What do you think? Might we explore this spiritual path together?" It includes seven topics, each with a video animation, a video story, and a short downloadable guide with additional ideas and explanation. The resources are arranged logically to give them a shape, but please don't follow the order! Go to the section that most interests you.

The National Lottery Community Fund Improving Lives

The National Lottery Community Fund's Improving Lives programme is open to voluntary or community organisations. The programme aims to help people facing challenging circumstances especially activities that mean people:

- are better able to identify ways to take control over their lives and build resilience
- are able to shape the activities and services they use to better meet their needs
- have more access to support and opportunities to improve their lives

The grants range from £10,001 to £200,000.

KFC Foundation

Grants of between £200 and £2,000 are available for projects which empower disadvantaged young people in the UK to fulfill their potential. The funding is being made available through the KFC Foundation and is available to local charities, registered community interest companies, unincorporated clubs and associations that have a turnover of less than £300,000 which have a local KFC restaurant in their community.

Childs Charitable Trust (UK)

The Childs Charitable Trust is a grant-making trust, supporting Christian UK registered and excepted charities and organisations both in the UK and overseas. During 2017 the Trust awarded grants to 81 different organisations all based in the UK but operating in more than 100 different countries worldwide. Projects will be considered that fall into the following categories:

- Youth the trust looks to support projects working in schools and with vulnerable and disengaged young people in the UK. Supported activities may include RE Lessons; School Assemblies; Lunchtime/After school clubs; Evangelism; Personal Development Programmes; Homelessness Prevention.
- Outreach the trust works to share the gospel of Christ by supporting all aspects of Christian outreach both in the UK and overseas and can fund, for example, Church Plants; Overseas Mission; Training in Evangelism; Chaplaincy. Society the trust believes people of faith bring a valuable contribution to social action and justice and support initiatives that have a positive impact in their society. Grants could support, for example: Counselling; night shelters; alcohol/drug rehabilitation; homelessness; or prison/ex-offenders work.
- Education the trust supports initiatives involved in all areas of Christian education including Bible Translation; Media Initiatives; Bible Colleges; Literature; Apologetics. The primary focus for grants allocated in 2021 will be on those organisations who actively share the Christian gospel in their work.

The next closing date for applications is the 30th November 2021.

The Weir Charitable Trust

Small community groups and charities based in Scotland can apply to the Weir Charitable Trust for funding of up to £25,000 to support projects relating to:

- Sport i.e. encouraging and increasing public participation in sport
- Health i.e. the prevention or relief of sickness, disease or human suffering
- Culture i.e. supporting heritage through participation projects
- The advancement of animal welfare
- Recreational Facilities i.e. the provision or organisation of recreational facilities that are primarily intended for people who need them due to age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage and are available to members of the public at large.

Grants to Help Older People Lead More Fulfilling Lives

Barchester's Charitable Foundation is a grant giving charity that helps older people and other adults with a disability across England, Scotland & Wales to lead more fulfilled lives and reach their full potential. The Foundation's focus is on connecting or re-connecting people with others in their local community, helping combat isolation and loneliness and enabling people to be active and engaged. Funding of between £100 and £5,000 is available for individuals and small community groups to help improve people's mobility, independence and quality of life. Individual applications must be completed by a third-party sponsor such as a health care professional, social worker or charity/support group representative. Applications are assessed on a case-by-case basis, with funds allocated to those who demonstrate greatest need.

People's Postcode Trust Opens for Applications

The People's Postcode Trust has re-opened its grants programme and will award grants on a monthly basis until October 2021. Funded by players of the People's Postcode Lottery, the Trust makes grants to support smaller charities and good causes in Scotland under the following themes: • Improving mental wellbeing • Enabling community participation in the arts • Preventing or reducing the impact of poverty • Supporting marginalised groups and promoting equality • Improving biodiversity & green spaces • Enabling participation in physical activity • Responding to the climate emergency & promoting sustainability • Increasing community access to outdoor space Registered charities can apply for grants of up to £20,000, other not for profit organisations can apply for grants of up to £2,000 to support both project and organisation core costs. The funding is available for 12 months. To be eligible to apply, organisations will need to have an annual income of below £1 million with preference given to those with an income of below £500,000 per year. The Postcode Community Trust will operate on a monthly basis. On around the 1st of each month, applications will open, and organisations will be able to submit their request for funding until the maximum number of 150 has been received until the 1st October 2021.

AllChurches Trust

AllChurches Trust like to fund projects that demonstrate an impact on people and communities. Applicants should include clear (and where possible, measurable) outcomes for projects and demonstrate how they will ensure sustainability beyond our funding. It's also important to show how additional funding support will be sought to enable the project to be completed.

Our open grants normally fund capital projects and equipment, not salaries or running costs, with the exception of our transformational and Hope Beyond programmes. In most cases, we give a small percentage of the project cost as this enables us to say yes to more worthwhile causes, although we do occasionally give larger grants.

National Church Trust

Funding available for Scotland's cash strapped churches and chapels A range of grants are available from the National Churches Trust

Churches and chapels in Scotland needing funding for urgent repairs and maintenance are being encouraged to apply for grants from the National Churches Trust.

In 2021, the church support charity expects to allocate more than £1.5m to churches and chapels throughout the UK. Any church, chapel or meeting house in Scotland that is open for regular public worship can apply.
