As the town was very quiet we headed back up the High Street speaking to doormen on the way. We walked up to the Duchess then on to Society, from there we headed up to the station chatting to a few people on the way. While waiting on the train coming in we spoke to a young man from Dundee who had been out with a few mates. He was telling us that he had a child and another on the way. Pray that all will go well for this family. We also spoke to a young lady who had been out with some uni friends, she was also a paramedic based in Arbroath but she told us you can be in Aberdeen one minute then a call to go someplace else. Pray for journeying mercies as she goes about her duties. When the Dundee train came in there was a bit of a fight and people were jumping from the train and getting involved. When things quietened down the guard phoned the police which held up the train. One of the men who was fighting got a cut on his head we cleaned it up and told him to go home and he went away. We spoke to a young man from the train he was telling us that the two guys were arguing on the train. Pray that their differences would be resolved.

After the train left we headed to the Salvation Army Hall for our break when S.D. and L.C. went home. We headed down to Society where we walked about until 2.45 as it was very quiet we headed back to Salvation Army Hall to get ready to go home.
