# **Sunday Services**

Attendances at our Sunday services since we started back in April have been encouraging despite the severe Covid-19 restrictions, which thankfully are now easing a little. A significant number of people have been taking advantage of the online streaming - approximately the same as those attending. If you wish to view the services online via Zoom and have not done so already, please pass your email address to George Drummond and we will send you the link.

The audio output from the service can now be listened to at home on an ordinary phone. This is done by phoning an Edinburgh number and entering a simple numerical code when asked - in the same way that one would enter a phone number. This might appeal to members who do not have access to technology. Please ask for details if this is of interest.

Our permitted capacity now for worship is dictated by the 2 metre rule. In the Sanctuary there are 44 locations marked out including for those on duty. 6 of the places are able to be used by couples so that the maximum possible is 50, which by coincidence, was the legal cap until recently. We can now accommodate a further 20 members in the Methven hall, where they can view the streamed service on the screen. For special occasions where we know in advance the make-up of those attending - i.e. couples, family groups - it is possible to increase our capacity a little by rearranging the pattern of seating.

The four town centre churches have decided to organise a clothes bank for children's clothes and are looking for donations of good quality children's clothing (birth to 16 years), laundered and ready to be given out. Packs of new underwear and babies' nappies will also be welcome.



The "Clothes 4 Kids" project starts on 2nd August and will be open on a Monday and Wednesday morning in St Bryce Kirk. # Jenny Featherstone - Zambia March 2021


Dear church friends.

Warm greetings from Zambia, although Lent is generally thought of as a season of giving up, this year, for Britain at any rate, it is a season of coming back. Thanks to your vaccination plan, things are gradually returning to normal, including kids going back to school.

Here in Zambia there is little change, but we are hopeful that the South African strain which has been prevalent for the last few months, is waning now. Nevertheless, our government is struggling with billions of dollars of unsustainable debt, so even with an election looming in August, they cannot provide such essentials as PPE for the covid wards. The two we are supporting in Mansa are desperate. James (a charge nurse) texted, "we have run out of disinfectant and gloves and N95 masks please reply, down on our knees for help" and "we have been having difficulty with supplies from the government,

this money (we gave £50.00) will go a long way in our

operations".



This year we are very thankful for good rains, even though the rain is tailing off now, the dams (reservoirs) remain full, so full in fact, that my friend Emma collected 5kg of small Bream that had spilled over the dam wall, into the sodden grass below it.

My main emphasis since I last wrote has been supporting CADRO. Maketo came up with the idea of 3 recovering alcoholics walking to Lusaka from Choma (just over 300km) to try and raise funds for a counselling centre which will support addicts, recovering addicts and their families. The need for this is huge, Zambia has the highest alcohol addiction amongst women in Africa, and the local brew is downright dangerous as methylated spirits and industrial urea (meant for the crops) are often added to it. Whilst local community leaders are concerned, there is little they can do about illicit alcohol. CADRO wants to offer practical help and advice in their communities, and provide counselling and other resources to help people come off alcohol and drugs.

One of our members, an engineer in his early 30's, was so hopeless and dejected that he made a serious attempt at ending his life, he was found in time and ended up in the mental health ward, from where he was referred to CADRO at the end of last vear. Now he is sober, back in employment and thanking God for his recovery. He and his mother gave a very frank and open talk on the local radio station YGFM which gives CADRO an hour every Saturday afternoon. Mum stated how she had given up on him and didn't want to have him around, but now thanks God for the difference in his life. There are many more people like these which CADRO wishes to help to turn their lives around, and if we can manage it, the counselling centre will be a significant move forward.

### Items for prayer

- For Marita, her visit to Luanshya hospital for elephantitis was not very successful and she is still in a lot of pain. The plan was for her to stay there for treatment, but she was sent home the same day She had an arduous 3-day journey back to Chapata, staying overnight in the broken-down bus.
- For Bridget who looks after Nathan and his sisters, she is very run down with an
  infected wound from a caesarean, gall stones which couldn't be operated on till
  after the birth, and is just recovering from malaria, as well as a new baby to look
  after.
- For the fundraising efforts of CADRO to touch the hearts (and pockets!) of local businesses, and for them to be able to inform many on their walk to Lusaka next month.

#### Items for praise

- For dedicated and capable people like Jane Mwenda and the Play4all volunteers
- For Nathan, as he has been off dialysis for over 3 weeks now and back with his sisters in Mansa. We hope he will soon be tablet and diet controlled then possibly stop the medication altogether.
- For the motivated CADRO members who meet weekly to support each other. They
  have changed their lives and are determined to keep away from alcohol addiction.

## Update from Louisa Turner, Development Worker

Firstly, a big HELLO to you all. It seems such an age since I saw my friends from Bennochy face to face. Secondly, so much yet so little has happened in the past eighteen months.

For the majority of the pandemic I have been on furlough from my post as Development Worker for Bennochy Church. During that time I remained well and virus free. I walked a plenty and enjoyed the downtime with a much slower pace of life, saving on fuel but having more screen time with online meetings than I had ever experienced. I did not realise that previously I had been going 100 miles an hour with all my commitments. God has been good to me and my family and, dare I say it, we have had a good year together, though I missed my grandchildren in Cambridge terribly. Seeing them in person recently rather than on screen was very surreal, but gave me such a warm glow inside and the biggest cheesiest smile.

I was fortunate to have the opportunity to work on a second part time job for some of the year and reaped many benefits through that. The job was through the intergenerational organisation Generations Working Together, whom I have volunteered with since 2016. I am the Fife Network Coordinator which allowed me to be included in many online meetings and workshops, opening new doors and contacts which I can, in turn, tap into in my role as development worker for Bennochy Church. I have so many ideas which we can develop in the future when restrictions have eased. Sharing my experiences from Bennochy Church, I have been able to form relationships in the community with various people in Fife and beyond. Following a workshop, someone in East Lothian contacted me wanting to hear more about the Open Door Project, which he wishes to replicate in his own church and community!

I have continued to be active with the Fife Interfaith Group, representing Bennochy and the Church of Scotland. Though this past year we have met online, it has been good to mix and share our individual faiths and have fun together. Recently I was on a quiz team for Fife, at the Scottish Interfaith Annual Quiz. The quiz was all based on world religions and it was remarkable that Fife came second! Please contact me if you would like to join a monthly meeting. There are speakers from a variety of backgrounds, some religious some not, but all very interesting. When not online, meetings have been held in Kirkcaldy Mosque.

For the summer, my role along with the Open Door team is to focus on reopening the Olive Branch Café. Over the coming weeks I will be contacting individuals who have previously volunteered in the café to see how they feel about returning. I will also be recruiting new volunteers, so if you have a fancy to help others and have a couple of spare hours a week, please do get in touch with myself or any of the Open Door team. When the café reopens it will have a slightly different layout as we will be following the government guidelines on hygiene, social distancing, and table service. There are roles a plenty for individuals who like to mix with others, from publicity and setting up, to preparing and serving refreshments and to clearing away the tables and chairs.

Everyone at Bennochy can play their part in the community café reopening – when the Olive Branch café official reopening date is announced for the autumn you can tell others, encouraging former and new customers in for a cuppa and blether again. Remember to tell them that the café does not operate for financial profit but, by volunteering or coming along as a customer you will profit in new and renewed face to face friendships.

Every £1 becomes £1.25. Gift Aid Declaration Forms are available at any time from Diane White or Margaret Kinnear or ask any Sunday Welcome Team member who will assist.
